I wanted to help others who struggle with issues similar to what I have struggled with in my life. I have dealt with being suicidal since I was 12 years old and I have called crisis hotlines as a caller and I wanted to give back to others.

What I find hopeful about this work is ...

I find it hopeful that there are people out there who care enough to give their time to help others in need. I also find it very rewarding to be able to relate to a caller and have them feel understood when they often don't feel understood by the mental health system.

What keeps me coming back is ...

When I am feeling down it helps me feel better when I'm able to help other people and give back to others. I find it very rewarding to see how appreciative some of our callers are and how much of a difference we can make in the lives of others.
